Rabbi's Message

When most of us think of Chanukah, we think of a male dominated story. The main theme is the military and religious fight of the Maccabees, led by Mattathias and his five sons, against the Assyrian Hellenists. What is little known is the the role played by two women, Judah and Hannah, against the tyrannical Antiochus.

During the siege of the Jewish city of Bethulia, the widowed daughter of the High Priest Jonathon, is determined to assassinate the Assyrian general, Holofernes. The General was about to lay siege and destroy her town. Acting as if she was forced to flee Bethulia accompanied by her maid, Judith reached the military camp. She convinced Holofernes that victory would soon be his since the besieged

city would be out of food within five days. The General invited Judith into his tent hoping to seduce the beautiful widow. Instead, Judith fed him salty cheese which caused him to drink too much wine. After Holofernes fell asleep, Judith grabbed his sword, chopped off his head and brought it in a sack to the elders of Bethulia. Seeing the Holofernes was dead, the defenders of the city invaded the military camp and annihilated the leaderless troops.

Another legend tells of the story of Chana, a mother who is forced to watch while King Antiochus tortures and murders her seven sons when they refused his command to eat pork. (Other versions claimed that Hannah's sons refused to bow before idols.) When it is the youngest son's turn, the King urges Chana to convince her son to eat the pork and spare his life. Instead she told

her son to follow the example of his older brothers. When the youngest son is about to be murdered, she kisses him and whispers to him: "Say to Father Abraham, do not pride yourself on having built an alter to offer your son Isaac. Our mother built seven altars and offered her seven sons in one day. Yours was only a test. Hers was real.

As the letter of the dreidel proclaim, "nas gadol haya shom."----"A great miracle happened there." May G-d continue to guarantee the existence of the Jewish people." And may the Jewish people merit the achievements of their ancestors.


