From our Rabbi

For years the State of Israel has been ruled by a coalition of right wing politicians and religious leaders. While I do not envision Israel becoming a theocracy, the demands of political parties have stymied democracy in Israel. Though a traditional rabbi myself, the reality is that all Israelis should have the right to pursue their beliefs. Marriage by both non-Orthodox rabbis and civil marriages should be recognized.

Experimentation with different expressions of Jewish belief should be encouraged. There is no place for exemption from the army. But to be fair, it was that great secular leader, the first Prime Minister of Israel, David Ben-Gurion, who precipitated the religious-secular divide in the Jewish state. In exchange for political control, the Orthodox Rabbinate was given control over religious matters—**HOPING THEY WOULD NOT INTERFERE IN THE COUNTRY'S SECULAR POLITICS!** History has proved "THE OLD MAN" wrong.
