Although Mom and Dad had visited Don and Sharon and the boys in Racine for many years they had not been to BIS. Shortly after they finally moved there in 2005 I surprised them with a visit on Thanksgiving morning, which was also their 60th anniversary.

On Friday I said "let's go to temple tomorrow". After that first service with then Cantorial Soloist Marty, they became regulars and temple members. Months later they celebrated his ordination as with Racine Jewish community. They stayed engaged in the temple, attending services regularly, and all the Jewish holidays with Rabbi Marty. He was both their spiritual leader and friend.

And this relationship became even closer after Dad's passing. Mom took Hebrew classes from Rabbi Marty, Thoroughly enjoying the challenge and learning experience. As recently as a couple of weeks ago, Rabbi Marty, and his lovely wife Marcia, had a video call with Mom, lifting her spirits.

We are very grateful to Rabbi Martyn Adelberg for his support, spiritual guidance, friendship, and love to Mom and our family.
