Rabbi Marty,

Our Rabbis declared, after the victory of Mordechai and Esther over the evil Haman, "mi shenichanas Adar Marbim b'simchah." Whoever enters the month of Adar must do so with JOY and HAPPINESS. The special Maftir reading ON Shabbat Zachor, the Sabbath of Remembrance, emphasizes that we must do everything possible to destroy the influence of Amalek from the face of the earth. Who are the Amalekites? They were a Canaanite tribe that attacked the most defenseless rear rank of Israelite women and children during the exodus to G-d's promised land of Israel. This reading always comes the Shabbat before Purim. Why? Because Haman was a descendant of the Amalkites.

What does it mean to "DESTROY EVIL?"

Does it mean to kill anyone we suspect of genocide—like surviving Nazi assassins or others with evil intentions towards the Jewish people, modern Israel, our fellow Americans or other friends and allies? OR does it mean to eradicate all linguistic perpetrators of evil—like those idiot congressional representatives who fear our country will be attacked by "Jewish laser beams," George Soros "deep state" pornographers and pedophiles? While occasionally prudent statesman may feel obligated to choose the former option, all Jewish and Gentile humanitarians, regardless of political stripe, must choose the second option. Georg Stern, Adar 24, 5781—March 8, 2021 June 12, 1913—March 19, 2001

Many of you may remember George Stern. He has been gone only twenty years. He and his wife, Mary, were deeply involved in every corner of our Jewish community—religious, charitable and social. There were so many articles in the newspaper about him and his wife Mary hosting dinners and events for the congregation that there is not room here even for a summary. George and Mary Spira were married in Germany July 10, 1938. Later that year they were on a cruise when they received a telegram from home, "Don't come back." Kristalnacht was November 9, 1938. In June of 1939 they arrived in the U.S. and in July they settled in Racine, likely sponsored by an anonymous group here that sponsored a number of other European Jewish refugees. WWII began September 1, 1939. They had a son Michael, now in Colorado and a daughter Sandra who has passed away. The family lived on Kingston Avenue until they retired to a condo on Harborview Drive.

George had a brother, Willy, who settled in Kenosha. Together they bought an old Moon automobile and "bingo!" they were in the salvage business.

George and Mary owned the Stern Wastepaper and Iron Company at 1415 Durand for forty years. At one point, George's paper recycling tonnage was 100 tons per month, 40% of what the Journal Times was using. During the early 70's, when the recycling movement was rapidly becoming a "thing", George worked with the city and state governments to organize their recycling programs. The Journal Times published five photos of George's operation.

George and Mary kept a kosher home. They always arrived early at shul and sat in the same seats. George was Israel Bond chairperson of the Beth Israel Sinai board of directors, board member of the Racine Jewish Welfare Council, a member of sisterhood and a member of Hadassah. They often hosted dinners and events for the congregation and were heavily involved with building our synagogue at 944 Main which was dedicated in 1952. Like many others, George volunteered for Sisterhood's program to relieve the regular volunteers at local hospitals on Christmas Eve so that they could be with their families.
